## CPI Excel Version and Cover Sheet

\*Providers have until 02/25/2022 to complete the Provider Assessment. Therefore, this Excel version of the CPI serves as a preliminary draft. Pertinent information that has been sourced through publicly available research, collaborating organizations, and completed survey responses are included in the three worksheets:

- 1) **Cover Page:** An overview of the preliminary analyses of currently available data
- 2) **CPI Database:** Discrete data by organization currently available through publicly available research, collaborating organizations, and completed survey responses.
- 3) **Survey Email Status Database:** List of providers who have been sent the Provider Assessment and the status of their survey

## Notes for the Interactive CPI Dashboard

The final CPI will be delivered in the form of an interactive dashboard. Based on completed survey results, the following

- Organizations may be added or eliminated
- Organizations from the IRS Publication 78 may be "disqualified" from the CPI if they do not or are not likely to provide services that directly benefit or engage children and families (e.g., animal shelter that does not provide community facing programs)
