Children's Home Society of Florida (CHS) has been committed to the residents of Leon County since 1964 -- offering the right services at the right time.



- CHS co-founded the Community Partnership Schools™ model with the University of Central Florida in 2012 and has expanded to 31 schools throughout the state, including Tallahassee's Sabal Palm Elementary in 2018.
- Today, through 35+ partnerships, we're honored to provide on-site services to 500 students, 650 caregivers/family members, as well as residents within the surrounding 32304/32310 area.
- Sabal Palm Elementary, A Community Partnership School, is the closest in concept to a current Family Resource Center in Leon County.
- Community Partnership School foundational principles include collaborative leadership, engaging the community to determine the services and strategies to best address needs and leverage existing community resources to align outcomes, so everyone is working toward the same goals together!
- CHS has operated the Bridges program in Palm Beach County since 2010, funded by the Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County. This place-based strategy serves 1,290 parents with children aged 0-8 each year. Parents are engaged through outreach, coordination of services and the navigation and development of partnerships and strategic alliances.

CHS' Finances

- With a legacy spanning more than 120 years, we have a strong balance sheet, a large foundation and more than 90 days cash-on-hand, which is a greater amount than most non-profits.
- We have 120 years under our belt BECAUSE we are good stewards of funds awarded to us AND we operate like business.
- Because we are statewide, we can weather many storms and have the ability to cover program deficits when needed.
- However, if funding sources go away or are reduced, like what happened to VOCA at the CAC, we have the resources to locate other recurring funding sources or secure emergency funding to bridge the gap until more sustainable funding is secured.
- In absence of that, we will and DO close programs it is just good business sense, nothing more. We have been covering the deficit in the CAC for over a year, but we will have to make a decision soon.
- We are unapologetic about the cost of care, and are unwilling to compromise quality and we know what it takes to deliver; It means hiring the best talent at competitive wages and staffing for success. We are in a human services business and when you have the most talented, trained and prepared workforce, you tend to get the best outcomes.
